



Total Market Sales: 2015 to 2016

# 2016 Market Data Summary

The following report provides an overview of farmers' market activities in 2016. Insights include gross sales and sales by program type; dollars spent on produce versus processed foods and craft items; vendor and customer information; and WIC, Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (FMNP), and Double Up Food Bucks (DUFB) program information.




## Increased Customer Traffic



54% of reporting markets saw customer traffic increase or remain the same in 2016 compared to 2015.

- Reported sales at New Mexico's farmers' markets and farm stands decreased by 8%.
  But in 2015, only 10% of markets didn't report their gross income. In 2016, 30% of markets didn't report; this negatively impacts totals.
- 61% of the total market sales went to farmers, a decrease from 76% in 2015.
- The average number of vendors (about 20 per market day) increased slightly from 19 in 2014 and 2015.
- 56% of market managers received some pay, up from 49% in 2015.

## 190% Increase in EBT Sales



More underserved New Mexicans are using their EBT dollars to buy approved foods and fresh produce at the state's markets. This is money that benefits not only New Mexico's vulnerable, but also the state's farmers.
