
2020 MARKET DATA

Preliminary






2020 was an unprecedented year with far-reaching impacts on New Mexico's farming and ranching communities and the farmers' markets, farm stands, CSAs, mobile markets, coops, and grocery stores where they sell their produce. The pandemic caused disruptions, which is why this year's market data won't be finalized until later this year as markets still find themselves collecting information. Even the Department of Health wasn't yet able to provide final numbers for the Farmers' Market Nutrition Program numbers.


2020 Market Data Challenges

Market managers worked through many challenges during the 2020 season, including obtaining washing stations, finding protective supplies, and overcoming other unexpected obstacles. Market managers did their best to collect data about their markets in the chaos.

Double Up Food Bucks for the Win!

During 2020, SNAP and Double Up sales nearly doubled over 2019 (\$1.58M vs \$969K). Widespread economic hardship caused many New Mexicans to increase their SNAP usage, including Pandemic Electronic Transfer cards (P-EBT), which led to a huge increase in Double Up Food Bucks program usage. New Mexicans used P-EBT cards to purchase locally grown foods at participating Double Up Food Bucks outlets.
