










For New Mexico's farmers' markets, farm stands, mobile markets, CSAs, and grocery stores, 2021 was the second year of managing the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic.


Double Up Food Bucks provided an additional \$1M to SNAP shoppers who experienced increased need due to continued the widespread economic hardship. This included Pandemic Electronic Transfer (P-EBT) shoppers who chose to spend their food dollars on locally grown vegetables and fruits.

Additional increases in gross sales resulted from more NMFMA member outlets reporting market data since 2015. While 2020 forced shopping outlets to manage new levels of flexibility and operational creativity that took precedence over administrative tasks such as collecting market data, 2021 brought a familiarity that allowed for those administrative tasks to once again be a priority. Outlets may be seeing the benefits of tracking market data for their own markets more than ever before.

Based upon market data collected by outlets across the state, agricultural and gross sales increased dramatically over previous years, largely due to the quickened pace of Double Up Food Bucks spending for SNAP recipients, including new Pandemic-EBT shoppers, because of the recent widespread economic hardship.

2021 was also the first year of the revamped FreshRx produce prescription program, which injected an additional \$50,000 to the states local food sales totals. Look for the expansion of the FreshRx program to contribute more to New Mexico's local food economy, and improve the health of at-risk New Mexicans, in the coming years.
